Moorings for Leisure Craft

Mooring of Leisure craft is a controlled activity per the Crown Estate Act 1961. To make an application for a new mooring within the Clyde area the Mooring Application Form (Scotland) should be used. Please fully read the guidance notes included with the form before completion.

Clyde Moorings Committee

The Clyde Moorings Committee acting under Deed of Appointment by Crown Estate Commissioners undertakes to administer applications for mooring of Leisure craft, issue Licences and collect Rent. The Committee was established in 1981 and marks 35 years of service to the marine community of the Clyde in 2016. It comprises stakeholders Clydeport, Bidwells (as Agents to the Crown Estate), the Queen's Harbour Master, RYA, Clyde Yacht Clubs Association, Clyde Fishermen's Association, British Marine Federation and Marine Scotland.

The Committee meets Quarterly in Greenock to review applications for moorings and other issues relating to the marine community on the Clyde. Their mission includes the equitable allocation of available resource, ensuring conflict is avoided with existing activities, structures and with the preservation of the marine environment.
