



PORT MARINE SAFETY CODE - Guidance for Terminals and Marinas

The Port Marine Safety Code (PMSC) sets out a national standard for every aspect of port marine safety. Its aim is to enhance safety for everyone who users or works in the UK port marine environment.

The PMSC strongly recommended that organisations or facilities which are not a statutory harbour authority, such as marine berths and terminals, seek a proportionate compliance with this Code through the adoption of a formal risk assessment process and the implementation of a Marine Safety Management System if deemed necessary. As the Statutory Harbour Authority for your location we encourage you, if not already done so, to consider the government guidance and establish a proportionate response to the code.
