Some of the showers will be heavy, especially over the northern half of the country, with the chance of few scattered thunderstorms there too. A clearance to mainly dry sunny weather will extend eastwards through the afternoon and evening, with just a few lingering isolated showers. Highest temperatures of 14 degrees in the northwest to 20 degrees in the east and south in light to moderate westerly breezes.  TONIGHT: It'll be mainly dry for much of tonight with clear spells. However cloud will move into the west and north later in the night, along with some outbreaks of showery rain there. It'll stay dry though across much of the east and south with clear spells.
