#### SHIPS' GARBAGE RECEPTION FACILITIES

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that, following the appointment of a new waste contractor at the Port of Liverpool, there are improved facilities for the reception of segregated ships' garbage in the quayside bins.

The *Garbage: Let's sort it!* campaign has been launched to highlight the requirement for garbage to be segregated and landed ashore into the correct quayside bins. Attached to this Notice is an example of the posters that are displayed at various locations within the Port of the signage on the quayside bins, which provide details of the types of garbage acceptable and not acceptable for the two types of quayside bins provided.

The quayside bins **must not** be used to dispose of bulky items or operational waste, such as mooring ropes, cargo residues, or pallets. If there is a requirement to dispose of such items, masters of vessels or their agents should email <a href="mailto:mersey.waste@peelports.com">mersey.waste@peelports.com</a> for advice and an estimate of the disposal costs.

Furthermore, International Catering Waste (ICW) **must not** be deposited into either the mixed-recycling or the general-waste bins. The arrangements for disposal of ICW are detailed in <u>Notice to Mariners Nº67/2021</u>.

# **Mixed Recycling**



# Mixed recyclables to be bagged in clear or coloured (not black) plastic bags.

- All types of plastic bottles & film
- · Aluminium and steel cans/tins
- · Glass
- Paper
- Cardboard



- No Hazardous Waste, including oily rags
- · No aerosols
- · No paint or paint tins
- · No oil drums
- · No liquids
- · No food waste
- No International Catering Waste
- No operational wastes; for example, mooring ropes and pallets











**General Waste** 



# General waste to be bagged using black plastic bags.

- Contaminated paper and cardboard
- Small amounts of kitchen and food waste (but not ICW)
- · Plastic bags
- Small amounts of Non-Hazardous sweepings
- Anything else that is not recyclable and non-hazardous



## No plastic bags containing mixed recyclables.

- No Hazardous Waste, including oily rags
- · No aerosols
- No paint or paint tins
- · No oil drums
- No liquids
- No glass
- No International Catering Waste
- No operational wastes; for example, mooring ropes and pallets
